Dear Friends,

Our 74th year of ministry is unlike any previous year! As we approach the summer months, the world is facing a global pandemic, and we are facing difficult decisions regarding the ministry of Highlands Presbyterian Camp and Retreat Center this summer.

Residential Summer Camp is the foundation on which the ministry of Highlands is built, and it is the heart of our mission. The Highlands Committee and staff have been carefully considering guidance from government and health officials, the American Camp Association, the Centers for Disease Control and Boulder County Public Health. Our first priority is always to provide a safe experience for our campers, guests and staff.

In light of the available information, we have made a decision to suspend residential summer camp for this summer. This is a heart-breaking decision made for the safety of our campers, volunteers and staff.

We have not yet made a decision about the feasibility of **Partnership Day Camp**. We await further guidance and conversation with our partner congregations.

Faith formation, community building and fun are some of the things that make Summer Camp so special, and we believe that there is a way for us to continue to offer these to families and campers this summer. Virtual Camp, Camp in Box, (or help us think of a great name), will offer small group Bible studies, singing, interactive live-streamed games, service projects, artsy crafts, and more! Campers and families will get to interact with each other and with Summer Program Staff including Dot Strickland, J.T. Schexnader and Brian Leisher. Plans are underway to offer six weeks of online programming, with weekly check-ins with your counselors following your week of virtual camp! And, if we can do it safely ... we hope to bring campers and their families to Highlands for a day or an overnight as a part of your experience!

We plan to offer one age group per week, and there will even be a "You and Me!" week for younger campers and their special adult. You will each get to "Zoom in", even if you are not in the same place! We will also provide parents with support and online gatherings as they talk with their child about their experience at camp and explore questions of faith!

We also do not know when Highlands will reopen to guest groups. This will depend on the guidance we receive from government and health officials; and when we reopen, it may look very different. We may open to smaller groups before we can open to larger groups; we may need to change our style of meal service; and we may need to take new steps to insure the safety of our guests and staff. It is too early to know what will be required for us to reopen.

Since March 25, we have furloughed most of our part-time hourly staff. Those who live on site were invited to stay. Many have decided to use this time to stay with family. We cannot wait for the day when we get to invite them back!

There have been blessings in this time ...

- It is has been an opportunity for our wells and water sources to rest and replenish. And we have also made application to add water from Rock Creek into our water system.
- It has been an opportunity for us to remove all equipment from the kitchen and hall of the Retreat Center and strip and refinish these floors.
- It has been an opportunity for us to do major repairs on both the freezer in the kitchen and our wastewater plant pumps.

As we consider our finances at this time, we begin with gratitude!

- Significant gifts in 2018 and 2019 allowed us to fully fund our advance deposits for guest groups and campers. As an act of partnership and goodwill we are returning deposits to all those who must cancel their stays at Highlands for 2020. To date, we have seen a loss of \$137,000+ in revenue from guest groups. Camper payments would have provided an additional \$95,000 in revenue. But we are grateful to have the cash reserves to return deposits and look forward to the day when all these people are able to come to Highlands.
- We are grateful that we have already qualified for a Payroll Protection Act loan. These funds will help us to continue to pay our full-time staff. All of our full-time staff continue to work both onsite and from home.



We invite you to consider a gift to Highlands if you are able. We know that "stay at home" orders do not affect everyone the same. For many this is a time of extraordinary financial strain. Let me assure you that we continue to hold you in prayer at our staff meetings each week. We meet via Zoom . . . and have continued our practice of weekly devotions and prayer.
